

Christchurch Director Killed at Port

A man who died after he was pinned between a truck and a forklift at Lyttelton Port was the owner of Christchurch company Drivertek.

William Frost, known as Bill, died in the industrial incident at No.2 Wharf at the port on Wednesday.

The 58-year-old, from Coalgate, was the owner of transport services firm Drivertek International Limited.

Police say he was crushed between the trailer of a logging truck and a forklift about 3pm.

It is believed he was standing near the stationary forklift when he was struck by the trailer.

Bystanders tried to save Mr Frost by performing CPR but could not revive him.

The Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment and police are investigating.
